
SECTION 1: OVERVIEW

These procedures outline the pathway for nomination to the 2027 Pan American Games for the United States Bowling Congress (USBC).

The maximum Team size can be two (2) male and two (2) female athletes; however final Team size will depend on earned Pan-American Bowling Confederation (PABCON) quota. PABCON quotas are awarded to the National Olympic Committee (NOC).

SECTION 2: SELECTION PROCESS DIAGRAM

The following provides a high-level overview of how athletes will be nominated to the Team:

SECTION 3: ATHLETE REQUIREMENTS

1. Nationality/Passports Requirements:
 - Have a valid United States passport at the time of Pan American Games nomination that does not expire for six months after the conclusion of the 2027 Pan American Games (Games).
2. Minimum Panam Sport Requirements:
 - Abide by the rules in the Panam Sports Constitution, including nationality/citizenship requirements.
 - For additional information regarding an athlete who is a national of two or more countries, has changed his or her nationality or acquired a new nationality, refer to the [Panam Sports Constitution](#) (Article 34.4-7).
 - Abide by the Panam Sports Eligibility of Conditions Form/Conditions of Participation Form
3. Local Organizing Committee (LOC) Requirements:
 - Comply with all rules and policies implemented by the LOC.
4. Pan-American Bowling Confederation (CF) Requirements:
 - Comply with all CF eligibility requirements which will be posted here once available: https://www.panamsports.org/en/documents/?doc_category=games
5. USOPC Requirements:
 - Comply with all USOPC rules applicable to the Games (e.g., Demonstrations).
 - Complete all USOPC Games Registration requirements by the stated deadline.
 - Comply with the USOPC Delegation Terms, including the Conduct Requirements, which will be made available here: <https://www.usopc.org/games-and-qualification>
 - Comply with the [USOPC Athlete Safety Policy](#) and the [U.S. Center for SafeSport Code](#) including education and training requirements.
 - Comply with the current [USOPC Background Check Policy](#).
6. USBC Requirements:
 - Comply with the [USBC Athlete Agreement](#)
 - Comply with the [USBC Code of Conduct](#)
 - Comply with the [USBC SafeSport Policy](#)
 - Athlete must have an active USBC membership.
 - Athlete does not have an active suspension from the U.S. Center for SafeSport that would make the Athlete ineligible to participate in the Games.
 - Athlete does not have an active sanction for an anti-doping rule/policy violation that would make the Athlete ineligible to participate in the Games.

SECTION 4: OTHER MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE TEAM

- Agree to be bound by and adhere to all Panam Sports, CF, WADA, USADA and USOPC anti-doping protocols, policies and procedures, as applicable. This includes participation in Out-of-Competition Testing and an agreement to be bound to the results management authority of the Panam Sports, CF, WADA, USADA, or other Anti-Doping Organization as applicable.
- Meet all health and safety protocols, to include vaccine requirements and/or testing requirements set forth by the government, local laws, USOPC, CF and/or the LOC.

SECTION 6: SELECTION PROCESS

6.1 TOTAL QUOTA PLACES:

Pan-American Bowling Confederation (PABCON) quotas are awarded to the NOC. The maximum Team size can be two (2) male and two (2) female athletes; however final Team size will depend on earned PABCON quota.

6.2 EVALUATION EVENT QUALIFICATION PATHWAY:

1. The 2027 US National Team will be selected at the 2027 Team Trials.

2. Each 2027 US National Team male athlete will be invited to participate in the 2027 Masters. Each 2027 US National Team female athlete will be invited to participate in the 2027 Queens.

6.3 NOMINATION TO THE TEAM:

Up to two (2) male and two (2) female athletes, dependent upon earned PABCON quota, from the 2027 US National Team will be nominated to the Pan Am Games based on points. The top two (2) men and top two (2) women, based on lowest points earned from the weighted events 2027 Team Trials and 2027 USBC Masters/USBC Queens will be nominated to participate in the 2027 Pan Am Games.

Pan Am Points will be derived using the following weighted events:

A. 2027 Team Trials

60% from 2027 Team Trials

(40% overall event points, 20% total pins)

- Team Trials will be conducted on five lane patterns, six games each day. Event points will be awarded each day based on finish position. Total pins for the five days also will be awarded event points in the same manner. (ex. 1st place = 1 point, 2nd place = 2 points, etc.)

B. 2027 USBC Masters (men) and 2027 USBC Queens (women)

40% from 2027 USBC Masters (men only) or 40% from 2027 USBC Queens (women only)

(30% qualifying position event points, 10% final bracket finish position event points)

- Using the formats for the USBC Masters and USBC Queens, points will be awarded based on final qualifying rounds position (ex. 1st place = 1 point, 2nd place = 2 points, etc.). Points are also earned by final bracket position (5th -8th place = 5 points, 9th -12th place = 9 points, 13th - 16th place = 13 points, 17th - 24th place = 17 points, 25th - 32nd place = 25 points, 33rd – 48th place = 33 points, and 49th - 64th place = 49 points).

All ties will be broken by total pin fall of combined events, 2027 Team Trials and qualifying of 2027 USBC Masters for men and 2027 USBC Queens for women.

A tie in total pin fall will be broken by highest total pin qualifier in the 2027 USBC Masters for the men, and 2027 USBC Queens for the women.

In the event of a conflict between this overview and the CF Qualification System, the CF Qualification System will take precedent.

SECTION 7: MANDATORY TRAINING AND/OR COMPETITION

Specify the location, schedule, and duration of all mandatory training and/or competition for athletes who are nominated to the Team.

All athletes who are nominated to the Pan Am Games Team will be required to attend the Pan Am Games Minicamp which will be held at the International Training and Research Center, Arlington, TX 76011.

Dates: TBD (*immediately prior to departure for the 2027 Pan Am Games)

- All athletes will be notified of the specific dates via email at least thirty (30) days before the Minicamp is scheduled to begin.

While waivers for mandatory training will not be unreasonably withheld, all athletes nominated to the Team should arrange for appropriate time off from school, work or other obligations in advance. Waivers will primarily be granted for injury or other similar incapacity or for a personal/family emergency. Requests for a waiver must be submitted in writing to the Director of High Performance as far in advance as possible.

SECTION 8: DATE OF TEAM NOMINATION

The nomination of athletes, including any replacements/alternates will be announced to all athletes and submitted to the USOPC on or before the USOPC deadline. The USOPC deadline will be communicated to the athletes once the deadline is confirmed.

SECTION 9: REMOVAL OF ATHLETES FROM THE TEAM

9.1 USBC JURISDICTION

USBC has jurisdiction over athlete nominees until athlete entries have been submitted by the USOPC to the LOC.

- A. An athlete who is nominated to the Team by USBC may be removed for any of the following reasons, as determined by USBC:
 - a) Voluntary withdrawal. Athlete submits a written letter to the USBC Director of High Performance

requesting to voluntarily withdraw from the Team.

- b) Injury or illness. A physician (or medical staff) approved by USBC provides certification that the Athlete has a debilitating condition. If Athlete refuses to provide verification of their illness or injury by a physician (or medical staff), their injury will be assumed to be debilitating, and they may be removed from the Team.
 - c) Failure to participate. Athlete does not participate in all Mandatory Training and/or Competition as defined in these procedures.
 - d) Code of Conduct Violation. Athlete violates the [USBC Code of Conduct](#)
 - e) Athlete Agreement. Athlete violates a term in their signed USBC Athlete Agreement.
 - f) Non-compliance. Athlete does not meet the athlete eligibility requirements listed in Section 3 and Section 4 of these selection procedures.
- B. An Athlete may be removed as a nominee to the Team or from the Team if found to have violated CF, WADA, USADA and/or USOPC anti-doping protocol, policies and procedures, the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, the USOPC Athlete Safety Policy and USBC SafeSport policies, as applicable.

9.2 USOPC JURISDICTION

- A. Once Athlete entries have been submitted by the USOPC to the LOC, the USOPC has jurisdiction over the Team.
- B. USOPC's Delegation Conduct Requirements apply in addition to the USBC Code of Conduct. The Delegation Conduct Requirements in the USOPC Games Delegation Terms are specific to each Games and are made available during the Games registration process.
- C. The USOPC's Grievance Procedures and Hearing Process are found within the USOPC Dispute Resolution Policy and Hearing Procedures.

SECTION 10: SELECTION PROCESS IF ATHLETE VACANCY OCCURS PRIOR TO SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES BY NAME TO THE LOCAL ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

- 10.1 Should a vacancy occur prior to submission of Entries by Name by the USOPC to the LOC, the next top man or top woman, based on lowest points earned from the weighted events (2027 Team Trials and 2027 USBC Masters/USBC Queens) will be nominated to participate in the 2027 Pan Am Games.
- 10.2 All replacement athletes must meet all requirements listed in Sections 3-4.

SECTION 11: SELECTION PROCESS IF ATHLETE VACANCY OCCURS AFTER SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES BY NAME TO THE LOCAL ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

- 11.1 Should a vacancy occur after submission of Entries by Name by the USOPC to the LOC, if allowed, the USBC will follow the process outlined in Section 11.1 to nominate a replacement athlete.

11.2 Any replacement of athletes must comply with these selection procedures in addition to Panam Sports, USOPC, and CF regulations including applicable Late Athlete Replacement (LAR) policies.

11.3 All replacement athletes must meet all requirements listed in Sections 3-4.

SECTION 12: RIGHT TO A HEARING

An athlete who is removed from the Team has the right to a hearing per the [USBC complaint procedures](#) (see National Bylaws – Due Process Supplement, Article 2) and the USOPC Bylaws, Section 9 (<https://www.usopc.org/governance/dispute-resolution>).

SECTION 13: REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

In addition to the USOPC Delegation Conduct Requirements, the following documents are required to be signed by an athlete as a condition of nomination to the Games:

SECTION 14: DISCLAIMERS

These procedures are based on Panam Sports and CF rules and regulations as presently known and understood. Any change in the selection procedures caused by a change in Panam Sports and/or CF rules and regulations will be distributed to the affected athletes immediately. The selection criteria are based on the latest information available to USBC.

However, the selection criteria are always subject to unforeseen, intervening circumstances, and realistically may not have accounted for every possible contingency. If any force of nature, pandemic, or force majeure, should cause the alteration or cancellation of any of the selection events listed in this document, these selection procedures may require revisions, pursuant to their resubmission to the USOPC.

SECTION 15: CONFLICT OF INTEREST

All individuals who developed these selection procedures (Section 21) must comply with the USBC [Conflict of Interest Policy](#) (see Ethics Policy III) to include completing and submitting a disclosure form consistent with the USBC Conflict of Interest Policy before convening the committee.

Additionally, any person with a good faith belief that a committee member has a conflict of interest may report the alleged conflict of interest to the USBC Ethics Committee. Reports may also be made anonymously through the [USOPC's Integrity Portal](#). No committee member shall retaliate in any way against a person who, in good faith, reports an alleged conflict of interest. In addition, the USOPC maintains a strict no retaliation policy that

prohibits any employee, contractor, agent, volunteer, or member of the USOPC to take or threaten to take any action against an athlete for reporting information to or seeking assistance from the Office of the Athlete Ombuds.

Any recused individual shall be replaced in accordance with the USBC Selection Committee appointment process.

SECTION 18: NON-RETALIATION

The USOPC and USBC have zero tolerance for retaliation against people who make good faith reports of potential ethical, policy, or legal violations, or who cooperate with investigations of those reports. That means no USOPC or USBC staff, Board or Committee member, or volunteer may threaten, harass, discriminate against, or take any negative employment or related action (e.g., discharge, demotion, suspension, negative review) on that basis.

APPENDIX B – GLOSSARY

Contingency means a future event or circumstance which is possible but cannot be predicted with certainty.

Delegation Event means the Olympic Games, the Paralympic Games, the Pan American Games, and the Parapan American Games.

Force Majeure means an event or effect that cannot be reasonably anticipated or controlled (e.g., hurricane, tornado, etc.).

Grievance Procedures means the process that enables an athlete to file a complaint with the USBC or USOPC.

Jurisdiction means the power or authority to make decisions and judgments.

Nominated means an athlete, coach or staff member whose name has been submitted to the USOPC by an USBC for participation in a Delegation Event.

Protected Competition means a Delegation Event or a Qualifying Competition.

Qualifying Competition means either of the following:

- i. **USBC Qualifying Competition:** Any competition or activity organized or approved by the USBC where the athlete's performance or results are considered in the published selection criteria to represent the United States in a Delegation Event.
- ii. **International Qualifying Competition:** Any international sport competition where (i) athletes represent the United States against athletes representing other nations, (ii) the USBC officially designates entrants, as required by the competition organizers, and (iii) athlete results or performance are included in the published criteria to qualify, or be selected, to represent the United States in a Delegation Event.

Selected means an athlete, coach or staff member whose name has been submitted by the USOPC to the LOC at the final submission date, as determined by the LOC.
