Cancer removed from a limited area is known as local therapy. Systemic therapy is used when the cancer has moved to other parts of the body, using drug therapies to fight cancer cells. Many of these treatments are used in conjunction with one another to rid the body of cancer. Treatments for breast cancer include:

- Local Therapy
  - Surgery
  - Radiation Therapy
- Systemic Therapy
  - Chemotherapy
  - Hormone Therapy
  - HER2-targeted Therapy
