Pink Facts

In 2020, approximately 168,000 women were diagnosed with metastatic breast cancer. Metastatic breast cancer or stage IV breast cancer is when cancer cells spread to other parts of the body. Signs and symptoms include:

- Fatigue
- Shortness of Breath
- Weight loss
- Bone pain
- Seizures
- Jaundice

These are common symptoms of other ailments, so it's important to discuss any symptoms with a healthcare provider and have routine doctor visits. Currently, there are treatments for all forms of breast cancer including MBC. To learn more about treatment, click the link below.
