2021 INTERCOLLEGIATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

WICHITA STATE SWEEPS TITLES AT 2021 ITC

The Wichita State women and men swept the titles at the Intercollegiate Team Championships for the third time in program history at the 2021 event in Wyoming, Michigan.

The women's program claimed their 10th Helmer Cup with the win, and the men's program recorded its 12th national championship. Both programs extended their own records for wins at the ITC with victories at the Spectrum Entertainment Complex, and they join the 1994 and 2009 Shockers in completing the season sweep.

The women's championship match came down to the final frame of the deciding game in the best-of-five Baker format, with Wichita State junior and National Collegiate Bowling Coaches Association Most Valuable Player Madison Janack delivering three strikes to shut out North Carolina A&T, 247-217, for the 3-2 victory.

The Wichita State and North Carolina A&T women exchanged victories through the first four games to set up the excitement in the finale (182-158, 194-202, 211-169, 178-200). In Game 5, the Shockers delivered three consecutive strikes, starting in the seventh frame, before handing the ball to Janack for the 10th.

North Carolina A&T, which was looking for its second ITC title since 2015, rolled four consecutive strikes in the middle of Game 5 and posted a strike in the ninth frame that forced Janack to get two strikes and one pin to lock up the title.

"I knew I needed to get two strikes, so I made sure to follow my process and keep my composure," Janack said. "I kept telling myself it was just me and my target. This is what we've been training for all season, and to be able to

KATIE ROBB, PETE VERGOS RECORD WINS AT 2021 ISC

Delaware State's Katie Robb and Calumet's Pete Vergos captured the first Intercollegiate Singles Championships titles for their colleges at the 2021 event at the Spectrum Entertainment Complex in Wyoming, Michigan.



Robb defeated North Carolina A&T's Ana Olaya in the title match, 186-166, and Vergos delivered a 205-167 win over Wichita State's Alec Keplinger.

The women's championship match provided both competitors with challenges as the 38-foot oil pattern began to transition.

Robb was down by 12 pins through four frames after back-to-back opens in the third and fourth frames. Olaya also opened the third and fourth frames, but she maintained the lead until the seventh frame.

Olaya left a 1-2-4-10 washout she was unable to convert, and Robb took advantage of a rolled 2 pin in the eighth frame to record a double and jump ahead in the match.

With Olaya finishing first, Robb stepped up in the 10th frame needing nine pins to claim the victory, and she delivered a strike to secure the win.

"It's surreal," Robb said after the victory. "I'm very honored to be able to represent Delaware State and take home this



deliver to win the title is a dream come true. I've pictured this, dreamed of this and wanted it for so long. I wouldn't want it any other way, especially with this group of girls and the coaches we have. It's incredible."

The 2021 championship team for Wichita State featured Janack, Sierra Ciesiolka, Madisyn Hansen, Addie Herzberg, Sydney Hollinger, Sarah Klassen and Olivia Komorowski.

Janack also was named the women's ITC Most Valuable Player. She was joined on the all-tournament team by North Carolina A&T's Cameron Strombeck, Mount Mercy's Cassidy Courey, McKendree's Hope Gramly and Louisiana Tech's Allie Leindecker.

The men's title match also went to a deciding game, with the Shockers rolling to a 188-146 win in Game 5 to defeat St. Ambrose, 3-2.

Wichita State and St. Ambrose exchanged wins on the left lane during the first four games of the men's finals (197-196, 171-190, 200-167, 174-182).

win. Being able to seal the deal in the 10th frame is one of the best feelings ever."

Robb made a ball change during the championship round after recording a 215-195 win over McKendree's Isabel Allen in the semifinals, and she made sure to keep an eye on her angles during the title tilt.

Olaya earned her spot in the finals with a 204-189 win against Indiana Tech's Maryssa Carey.

In the men's final, Vergos started off strong. After a spare in the first frame, he rolled three consecutive strikes to build an early lead over Keplinger, who was struggling with his ball reaction after switching from urethane to reactive.



Vergos was the only student-athlete playing the middle part of the lane during the two semifinal matches on the 39-foot oil pattern, and he was able to continue striking after recording a 254-192 victory over St. Ambrose's Jordan Monnens. Vergos started his semifinal match with seven consecutive strikes.

Vergos briefly opened the window for Keplinger with a missed 10 pin in the fifth frame, but he was able to stay clean for the remainder of the game to roll to the title. Keplinger rolled a double in the fifth and sixth frames but followed with opens in the seventh and eighth frames.

The 41-foot oil pattern used during the week and finals did not allow either team to get comfortable under the television lights, but Wichita State felt confident getting to finish the match on the left lane as the top overall seed.

The Shockers started Game 5 with three consecutive strikes to get out to the early lead and maintained the advantage as St. Ambrose opened in four of its first six frames.

Wichita State added strikes in the sixth, eighth and ninth frames to secure the win. The team featured Brandon Biondo, Briley Haugh, Cameron Hurwitz, Alec Keplinger, Richard Paul III, TJ Rock and Nick Sommer.

"We've been through a lot since Day 1," Biondo said. "We had a lot of confidence heading into the postseason last year, but it was cut short. This year was different. We lost a few seniors and, to be honest, came out a little flat to begin the year. We grinded throughout the season, found the right mix and all just came together and clicked at the right time. We never gave up and made the shots we needed down the stretch, and this is a moment we'll remember forever."

St. Ambrose's Cameron Crowe was named the men's ITC Most Valuable Player. He was joined on the all-tournament team by teammate Nathan Stubler, Wichita State's Biondo and Keplinger, and Emmanuel's David Hooper.

The 16 men's and 16 women's teams at the ITC qualified by finishing in the top four at one of four sectional events held in April. At the national tournament, teams bowled 24 Baker qualifying games to determine seeding for the double-elimination bracket, which featured best-of-seven Baker matches leading up to the title matches. The championship round featured best-of-five finals.

For Vergos, the win also was for his Crimson Wave teammates and the program that put trust in him as a student-athlete.

"We all have goals, dreams and aspirations," said Vergos, a two-time National Collegiate Bowling Coaches Association All-American. "But you can never prepare yourself for when it actually becomes a reality. It's something I've worked very hard for, but it's also for the people who have supported me day in and out. I wanted this for me, of course, but I'm nothing without my teammates and coaches. I feel Calumet College was able to put trust in me and give me the confidence moving forward competing for a top-tier program. I knew I was going to be able to elevate my game to new levels and heights, because it's something the program sets out to accomplish each year."

Keplinger advanced to the championship round by defeating Lindenwood's Andrew Sacks, 212-183.

The 2021 ISC featured 24 men and 24 women representing their schools in the national singles event. Individuals earned their spots at the ISC through four sectional qualifiers held throughout the country in April.

At the Spectrum Entertainment Complex, all ISC qualifiers bowled six games of qualifying to determine seeding for the single-elimination bracket, with the top eight seeds in each division earning a first-round bye. All bracket matches leading up to the semifinals and finals featured a three-game total-pinfall match to determine which player advanced.
