In addition, no substance may be placed theis bowling balls prior to certified competition The use of abrasives strictly is prohibited once the bowler's first ball is thrown in competition. The outer surface of the bowling ball may only be cleaned with a dry towel once the bowler has begun competition.
No alterations to static weight of bowling balls may be made after they have been checked through the scale room for that day's competition.
