EACH YEAR, THOUSANDS OF

BOWLERS head to USBC Championship Tournaments. For many of these bowlers, the only question they usually ask is: "When are we bowling?"

Behind every team is a team captain who takes care of the rest of the details – assembling the team or teams, going online to reserve specific dates and times, collecting money and making payments, setting the

pairs for doubles competition ... and that's just for the tournament entry. Many also take care of hotel and travel arrangements for their teams.

Some captains bring one team and possibly a companion team, but quite

a few more will put together several teams for championship tournaments. For those team coordinators, USBC has a special club.

The USBC Championship Tournaments Captain's Club provides special benefits to captains bringing six or more fully-paid teams



to the USBC Open Championships or those who have any combination of six or more teams for the Women's Championships and the new USBC Mixed event. For example, if you are the team captain of four teams for the Women's Championships, then put together two teams for the Mixed and you're in the Captain's Club. USBC will contact those who qualify for

the Captain's Club about 1-3 weeks after they submit their teams. But what, exactly, is the Captain's Club?

Captain's Club members receive several benefits, including a USBC Captain's Club

polo, a tournament photo package to remember the tournament experience, a \$25 voucher for a selected restaurant, a \$25 savings each way on their shipment through Bowling Ball Express, a really cool messenger bag, plus several other benefits. "Being a team captain and coordinating a big

YOUTH BOWLING

ROLLING THROUGH THE SUMMER

SUMMER IS A GREAT TIME to relax, hang out with friends and to basically do, well, nothing. For top youth bowlers, the break from school wasn't a time to slow down but instead it was time to kick it up another notch.

About 100 youth bowlers had the opportunity to attend the annual Bowling Combine for College Prospects at the International Training and Research Center in Arlington, Texas, in late July. Participants were selected based on their application, which asks about bowling scores and academic work, and the program has been at capacity each of its four years.

The Bowling Combine brings together youth bowlers who want to compete at the collegiate level and college coaches looking for talented bowlers for their programs. Six countries and 27 states were represented by student-athletes this year and about 30 college coaches attended.

The Team USA coaching staff put the student-athletes through tests to evaluate skills such as shot repeatability, release ratio, spare proficiency, breakpoint management, vertical leap, and balance. The student-athletes also had the opportunity for one-onone meetings with collegiate coaches.

"The reason why we come here is they do a phenomenal job," Ben Hoefs, coach at Spring Hill College in Mobile, Alabama, said of the Team USA staff that runs the Bowling Combine. "They get a lot of recruits who are very interested in the game, who want to get better. They also look at academics, as well."

But the Bowling Combine wasn't the only scouting trip for many college coaches. The week before the Combine, nearly 2,500 of the best youth bowlers in the nation, and collegiate coaches, were at the Junior Gold Championships in the Buffalo, New York, area.

At this year's Junior Gold Championships, more than \$200,000 in scholarships were awarded, national champions were determined in six divisions and spots on Junior Team USA were decided.

The Junior Gold Championships culminated an outstanding year for the Junior

Gold program, which set a record by surpassing the 5,000-memberships barrier for the first time. The



previous membership total of 4,376 USBC Youth members who joined the Junior Gold program was reached last season.

The event also has added a new presenting sponsor. The 2015 event in Chicago and the 2016 tournament in Cleveland will be the Junior Gold Championships presented by Storm, Roto Grip and Master.

ALL AMERICAN FAMILY TOURNAMENT

WITH NEW EVENT, IT'S ALL RELATIVE

WHEN CHILDREN START TO PLAY

SPORTS, the parents are put into the familiar roles of coaches, equipment managers, food and beverage providers or simply fans. When the kids take the field, the parents take their place on the sidelines.

But one of the more unique elements of bowling is that unlike other sports, parents and kids actually can have a competitive game on the same playing field.

The new All American Family Tournament, developed through International Bowling Campus Youth Development and the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America,

will provide families the opportunity to compete together on the lanes.

The tournament, designed to engage families who love to bowl, will be a premier national event to showcase the more recreational side of the game.

"We'll have families competing together and with several age-based divisions we will provide a competitive and fun experience for everyone," said USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy.

Bowling centers will have the opportunity to conduct qualifying events and winners of those events will advance to the national championships set to take place in Chicago from July 7-9, 2015. All participants must be



USBC members to take part in AAFT qualifying events.

"For bowling centers, this is a wonderful way to bring families together on the lanes," BPAA Executive Director Frank DeSocio said. "Bowling always has been a family sport and this will be a fun event everyone."

The AAFT qualifiers can be a league or tournament, though league qualifying events must be a minimum of 16 total games and tournament qualifying events must be a minimum of three total games.

For each of the four divisions, one adult will be paired with one youth; divisions are based on the age of the youth bowler – Under 8, Under 12, Under 15 and Under 17 – and the adult must be at least 24 years old. The tournament also is a handicap-based event so centers can promote it to anyone who bowls, regardless of their age, skill or physical ability.

Centers can conduct qualifying leagues or tournaments through May 31, 2015. Any state/provincial championships must completed by May 31, 2015.
