After school, or out-of-school, programs are becoming more and more important to parents and kids. Did you know that as many as 15 million children return to empty homes each school day? Research has shown that in the hour after school is dismissed, violent juvenile crime doubles. The number of young people who become victims of violent crime also rises, and young people are more likely to take part in risky activities, from smoking and drinking to drug use and sexual activity.¹

A 2003 survey of 800 registered voters conducted by the Afterschool Alliance found that *nine out* of ten Americans think after school programs are important. Voters want after school programs in their communities because they provide a safe place for children and teens to go after school. In fact, 94% of survey respondents agreed that there should be organized activities or places for children and teens to go every day that provide opportunities to learn.²

Bowling is a great activity for kids to engage in after school. Not only does bowling provide a fun activity that virtually any child can enjoy, it also teaches them sportsmanship, teamwork, and character.

Starting an after school program is no easy task, but the rewards – both financial and the impact you can have on these students' lives – is well worth it!

Objectives

The objective of this chapter is to help you develop, market, and execute a successful after school program that will be enjoyable to students and revenue-generating for your center.

- What time are parents required to pick up their children?
- 2. Determine how you will handle transportation
 - There are several options for transporting students to your center:
 - Contract with your school to bus the students to you. Include the fee to cover this in the price of the after school program.
 - o Contract with your local public transportation provider, if applicable.
 - o Purchase your own bus.
 - Used school buses are often available for \$1,000 \$2,000. They must be repainted. A recent search on ebay.com yielded 112 buses, ranging in price from only \$100 to over \$50,000.
 - You will also need a specially licensed driver with a CDL (Commercial Driver's License) license with a P (Passenger) endorsement. Requirements for obtaining a CDL vary in each state. For a list of requirements for your state, log onto www.dmv.org. Hiring a retired school bus driver might be the easiest option.
 - Check with an attorney or your insurance agent to determine the best insurance coverage to protect you. (Note that laws vary in each state.)
 - In Ohio, for example, Camelot Lanes formed a separate company, Camelot Transportation Inc., at a cost of \$200 to mitigate liability from the bowling center. They pay \$2,500 per bus per year for commercial liability insurance.
- 3. Market the program to local schools
 - Meet with the School Principal. (You may also want to meet with the PTA group.)
 - o Prepare a sample flyer with the school's name on it. Target 1-2 schools that are close to your center to get your program started.
 - o Call to schedule an appointment with the principal.
 - Explain the benefits of bowling as an after school activity:
 - Bowling is a very popular activity (#1 participation sport in America).
 - It is a safe activity in a safe environment.
 - Students get involved in a lifetime sport.
 - Everyone can participate no one sits on the bench!
 - Students learn about teamwork, sportsmanship, responsibility and character.
 - Explain other benefits specific to your program (help with homework, awards, recognition, etc.).
 - Explain the program specifics:
 - Transportation
 - o Program schedule
 - o Program forms (sign up sheets, etc.)
 - Stress that the center handles everything. The only thing the school needs to do is pass out flyers and collect the completed sign-up sheets. Make it as easy for the school as possible!

- o Offer to provide free game passes that can be used as achievement awards for math, reading or other programs.
- After obtaining approval:
 - o Get the student count for each school.
 - Meet with the school secretary to deliver flyers.
 - o Pick up the sign-up sheets regularly.
 - o Prepare a roster for each school.
 - Finalize the details of transportation (where to meet students if you are picking them up, or what time they will arrive at your center if the school is bussing them).

4. Execute! Ensure that:

- all of your staff members are familiar with the after school program;
- coaches are available if you are providing instruction;
- you have a solid check-in and check-out procedure; and
- your program is fun so that kids will want to come back!

Successful Programs

<u>Camelot Lanes, Boardman, Ohio.</u> Camelot Lanes runs a very successful after school bowling program. Equipped with several busses and a coaching staff of ten, Camelot's program caters to 26 schools and brings over 600 kids per week into the center!

Camelot started with 2 schools and chartered busses. After seeing the potential for this program, they began purchasing their own busses and reaching out to more schools. (Peppe Smith purchased one bus on ebay.com for only \$1,500.)

Peppe's after school bowling staff consists of three retired teachers, early childhood education majors, and a PBA professional. Their knowledge of kids has proven invaluable to the program.

Their program costs \$6 per week and includes two games of bowling, the use of shoes, round-trip transportation to and from the school, an end-of-season party, and awards for each youngster. A snack can be purchased for \$1, and students get their choice of freshly-baked cookies, pizza, or a hot dog. Each snack comes with milk or a soft drink.

In addition to the \$6 weekly fee (\$6 x 600 students = \$3,600 per week!), additional revenue is generated by food sales, birthday parties, school fundraisers, and kids joining youth/adult leagues. Camelot's after school program now generates over \$100,000 annually!

Many of Camelot's marketing materials can be found at the end of this chapter.

<u>Meadow Bowling Lanes, Portland, Michigan.</u> Meadow Bowling Lanes, a 12-lane center in Michigan, runs an 8- or 10-week bowling program four days per week. The cost is \$7 per person per week and includes bowling, shoes, and transportation to and from school. Parents are

required to pick their children up at the bowling center, which generates additional_revenue (parents often have a snack or a drink while they're waiting for their kids to finish.)

Sempecks Elkorn Lanes, Elkhorn, Nebraska. Gateway Lanes offers a program for students in kindergarten through 5th grade. Bumper bowling is provided for beginners. Students meet each week on Tuesdays. They are picked up immediately after school and returned to the school at 5:20 p.m., or parents can pick up their children at Gateway Lanes. The cost is \$6 per week and includes 2 games of bowling, awards and trophies, parties, transportation, and use of shoes and ball.

Rose Bowl Lanes, Marshfield, WI. Rose Bowl Lanes gets approval from the school district to distribute a flyer or pamphlet in the school. (Once the schools are familiar with the program, they may not require this step.) Once the program flyer is approved, the school provides them with a roster of class enrollment, which allows them to make enough flyers and group them by class before distributing them to the schools (remember, make it easy for the school!). Flyers are dropped off at the school district office after they are prepared. Rose Bowl also delivers reward coupons for the schools to hand out to students for good behavior.

Students are given two weeks to return the registration form to the center. Each school is assigned a different day of the week for its program, but if students have a conflict, they can come on another school's day.

Each school meets one day per week. A schedule is developed at the beginning of the program for all area schools. The fall session runs from September through December, and the spring session runs from January through April. Students are bussed to the center. The program begins at 3:00 or 3:15 p.m., and parents pick up their children at the bowling center between 4:30 and 5:00 p.m.

The first afternoon is used as a registration day. Usually about 10 walk-ins come on the first day. Be aware that some kids are not used to riding a bus and may be scared, so make them feel

comfortable when they arrive at the center. Once everyone is registered, Rose Bowl does a trivia session, complete with prizes. They then go over basic rules.

Rose Bowl runs two sessions:

- 1. Kindergarten through 6th grade this group is divided into K, 1, 2-3, 4-5, and 6. One or two coaches are assigned to each group. The coaches must have a working knowledge of bowling and be Level 1 Certified.
- 2. 7th through 12th grades

Every three weeks, Rose Bowl holds a fun day. Bowlers receive prizes for strikes, spares, or achieving their average. For example, on Mardi Gras Day, students receive a set of beads for each strike rolled. Awards are also given out for rolling games 25 pins over their average and series 40 pins over their average.

There are two cost options:

- 1. \$5 per week includes bowling, shoes, activities, and awards
- 2. \$8 per week includes bowling, shoes, activities, awards, and their choice of either a ball, bag, or shoes at the end of the session.

Fees may be paid weekly, monthly, or for the whole session. There are no fees for missed weeks. When school is not in attendance (either scheduled or due to inclement weather), there is no bowling. A schedule is distributed on the first day.

<u>Plamor Lanes, Muscatine, IA.</u> Playmor's program runs once a week for 8 weeks. The program begins at 3:45 p.m., and parents pick up their children between 5:30 and 5:45 p.m. The entire cost of the program is \$48, preferably paid in advance. The program includes busing from the school, bowling, shoes, snack and drink, t-shirt, and awards.

The weekly schedule is:

3:45 - 4:00	Attendance
4:00 - 5:15	Instruction and bowling
5:15 - 5:30	Snack
5:30 - 5:45	Parents pick up

<u>Palmyra Bowling, Palmyra, PA</u>. All elementary schools students, grades 1-5, are invited on a first-come, first-served basis. There is a \$12 registration fee to cover transportation. The bus picks the children up at school and brings them to a bowling center. The bus is clearly marked "Bowling Bus."

Parents pick up their kids at the bowling center no later than 5:30 p.m. They must check their children out, and if they are sending someone else to pick their child up, arrangements must be made in advance.

The program costs \$5 per week and includes:

- 2 games of bowling
- shoes
- prizes (Refer to the "St. Joan of Arc Youth Bowling Program" flyer under "Marketing Materials" for details about weekly prizes.)
- Glow-N-Bowl party
- entry into "Games for Grades" program
- awards party on the last day
 - kids celebrate with pizza and soda
 - o parents and teachers are invited to attend

PROGRAM BASICS

CHECKLIST FOR AFTER-SCHOOL KIDS PROGRAM

- 1. Take the permission slip and large letter with the school's name to the school secretary. Put them in packets according to each class's homeroom size. This way, all the secretary needs to do is give to each homeroom teacher to pass out the students. We want to create as little work as possible for the school's staff.
- When the child decides he/she is going to sign up for the program, they just fill out and tear off the permission slip and put in large envelope. The top portion of the letter, and on the reverse side of the letter, which shows on a week to week basis our weekly incentive prizes, is for the parents to post on their refrigerator for a reference checklist. The incentive list is normally shrunk down smaller; so when you tear the permission slip off, you do not tear off some of the weeks. The letters from the children should be given to the school secretary.
- You only want to give the children about 7-10 days to return the permission slips in. Keep in mind, the longer you give them the greater the chance for them to just forget about it.
- As soon as you have all of the children's names that are going to participate in the after-school program, you need to make up a list grade by grade in alphabetical order and give to the school secretary. This way, she will know what children are participating on a week to week basis. Also, we call her the day of the program to see who is sick or went home early from school, so we are aware of what children will be boarding the bus. This way, we are not waiting at the bus for a child who is not going to be bowling that day.
- Next, you need to put the smaller envelopes in packs of 12. These are the payment envelopes each week that the children hand us when they board the bus. The reason each child gets 12 payment envelopes is because the program runs for 12 weeks. These envelopes, once in packs, are given to the school secretary to distribute to the homeroom teachers. They, in turn, give them to the children.
- 6. Last, but not least, you need to make this program fun for the kids. Also, you need to make sure you do it right the first time.

ITINERARY

- Before arrival, be sure house balls are out and bumpers are up and names are in the scorers.
- Chaperones must drive to the proper school. Take bowling bus signs with you. Ask school office to let us know who is sick. Be sure children line up to ride the bus.
- Collect weekly fees as children are boarding the bus. Check sheets by grade level.
- Make sure everyone is accounted for on the bus before departure and before leaving center.
- When bus arrives at center, children get off.
- Children form 2 lines, (boys and girls) to get shoes. Need to have 2-3 counter people, 1 to direct them to the correct lanes.
- Be sure coaches are at proper lanes. One coach per 6 lanes. Coaches must stay at lanes the whole session.
- No practice, start bowling ASAP. Open style bowling. Coaches need to put in any blind scores.
- Coaches must make sure kids are up when it is their turn. After 1 warning, the child is skipped.
- After bowling make sure children put away shoes and bowling ball and then board the bus.
- Remaining coaches clean up the area and help whoever needs helping.
- Make sure proper number of kids are on the bus, use the system with the checklist. Know the number that arrived and the number going back.
- Chaperone must stay at the school until all children have headed home.
- 14. Call center if necessary.



PROMOTIONAL KIT CONTENTS:

OBJECTIVES/RATIONALE:

To generate additional league lineage and revenue among the youth market after school and develop longer term customers as the youngsters learn and enjoy the lifetime sport of bowling. This program also provides youngsters with a worthwhile, safe and wholesome after-school activity which helps satisfy the need for latchkey activities. The School Bus program also will create more business as the children will come bowling with their families other days and times.

PROGRAM COMPONENTS:

The School Bus Program is a short-season program which includes two games per week, use of bowling sboes, round-trip bus transportation between the school and the bowling center, an end-of-season party and awards for each youngster.

PRICING:

The School Bus Program needs to be priced to include the two games of lineage, the cost of the bus, and the year-end party and trophy. The cost of the bus will be constant each week so divide the number of bowlers into that cost to help figure your weekly fees. Works well at \$6 per week.

TARGET MARKET:

The larget market is grade schools and kindergariens. Children in these grades are ideally suited for this program from a supervision and behavior standpoint.

BEST TIME TO RUN THE PROGRAM:

The best time to run the School Bus Program is after school on weekdays during the school year. You could even run various seasons – one leading up to the winter break and another starting after New Year's. In areas where schools operate year-round, there is also an opportunity to run this program in the summer. Including bus travel time, the program is structured as a 2 1/2 bour session.

IMPLEMENTATION/PROMOTION STEPS: (DETAILS: See General Instructions)

Promotion of the School Bus Program should start at least 60 days in advance of the program.

- · Visit with school Principals (not Administrators or PTAs) to explain the program and get an agreement for flyers to be inserted in the "Kids Take Home" packets.

SPECIAL NOTES:

Used school buses work well and insurance for this program is very reasonable providing use of buses is limited to this program.

State laws vary with respect to bus equipment allowed and licenses required. Make sure you are in compliance with your state's laws and regulations.

Safety and supervision are the number one priorities in this program. It is of utmost importance that the youngsters are transported safely and watched at the bowling center.
